

Rationale –the need to save money

- Focus on "between costs" – costs due to complexity in communicating across organizations

Clinical occupations include all people employed in health practitioners and technical occupations (class 29) and health support occupations (class 31), except for medical records and health information technicians, who are included in administrative workers. In addition, personal care aides and counselors are included as clinical.




Streamlined information flows

Information needs to flow to and from patients, providers, and payers.




- Public sector has weighted in
 - 2015 Roadmap; 21st

 - Implementing these directives will take energy.
- Attaching prices to complexity can be helpful.
 - E.g. prior authorization costs providers ~\$10 / claim.
 - Having firms pay for costs they impose on others would encourage streamlining requirements.
